NEW OIL FOR COMMON RAIL ENGINES

A new oil for use in all MAN common rail engines, Mobil Delvac1 (SAE 5W-40), is a fully synthetic engine oil that has been recently added to the MEC approved oils list. It will be listed in the next edition of the "MAN Fuels, Lubricants & Coolants" booklet, which is available on the MEC maintenance website at www.man-mec.com.

EXPANSION FOR MEC

MEC's new storage and production facility, adjacent to the main Headquarter building, was officially opened on August 21, 2006. The new building now houses the entire Axle Division under one roof. This move consolidates all functions and operations with the goal of streamlining production, cutting costs and allowing for production expansion.



NEW PRODUCT LINE READY TO GO

During the next 12 to 18 months, MEC looks forward to the implementation of a new single reduction rear axle for low floor buses. The new series, known as HY-1336-B, will offer the benefits of fewer moving parts, lighter weight disc brakes, reduced noise and less drag resulting in lower maintenance expenses, better braking capability, improved passenger comfort and better fuel economy. Corresponding front axles will also be available with disc brakes.

STEADY SALES FOR 2006

Sales remained steady for MEC despite last years delayed Federal Budget dollars affecting transit industries order books. This represents a slight market share increase for MEC and we look forward to further increases next year and beyond.

NEW GAS ENGINES FOR 2007

MAN is releasing its latest additions to the Natural Gas engine line, starting with the new V8 (E 2848LE322) engine which produces an output of 295 KW @ 1800 rpm and the V12 (E 2842LE322) engine with a maximum power of 440 KW @ 1800 rpm. Both engines are turbo charged and inter-cooled. The first North American engines are scheduled to start operation in January 2007.
